



A special Eucharistic Celebration will be organised once a year for family members and friends to celebrate and remember deceased parishioners. ### Flowers and Cleaning





### **Liturgy Committee**


This is a Group of parishioners planning, implementing and encouraging the Liturgy at St. Declan's through networking and communicating with the various ministries and groups.

#### **Music Ministry**

#### **Pastoral Care**

Pastoral Care embraces all aspects of parish life. We all care about each other and demonstrate this in various ways. Pastoral Care aims to provide spiritual nourishment, social interaction and support to parishioners who are bereaved (grieving), aged, infirmed, sick, disabled and unable to take part in parish Eucharistic celebrations by; (a) involving parishioners to minister to others and share their faith; (b) creating a community of care; (c) developing a strong parish network. One aspect involves bringing Holy Communion to, and sharing prayer (and social interaction) with: the sick and housebound parishioners; the local Nursing Home residents. 
